Hard Authority

The power to give orders and enforce obedience.

- **Extrinsic**
- **Hierarchical**
- **Commands obedience because it's punitive.**

Soft Authority

The power of influence.

- **Intrinsic**
- **Relational**
- **Persuades obedience rather than commands.**

God's authority is both hard and soft

**WHAT IS THE INTERNAL
EVIDENCE FOR THE
BIBLE'S AUTHORITY?**

The Bible claims...

Scripture

“You have heard it said, but I say to you...”

“Truly, truly, I say unto you...”

“And when Jesus finished these saying, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, for he was teaching them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes.” - Matt. 7:28-29

The Bible claims...

Scripture

- **Jesus refers to the OT as the present and eternal truth of God.**
- **Jesus assumes that OT prophecies must be fulfilled.**
- **Jesus treats the miraculous events of the OT as if they occurred exactly as written.**
- **Jesus never said anything about problems in the Scriptures.**

“He called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every affliction.” - Matt. 10:1

“These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.” - John 14:25-26

Popularity, however, is not the same as authority.

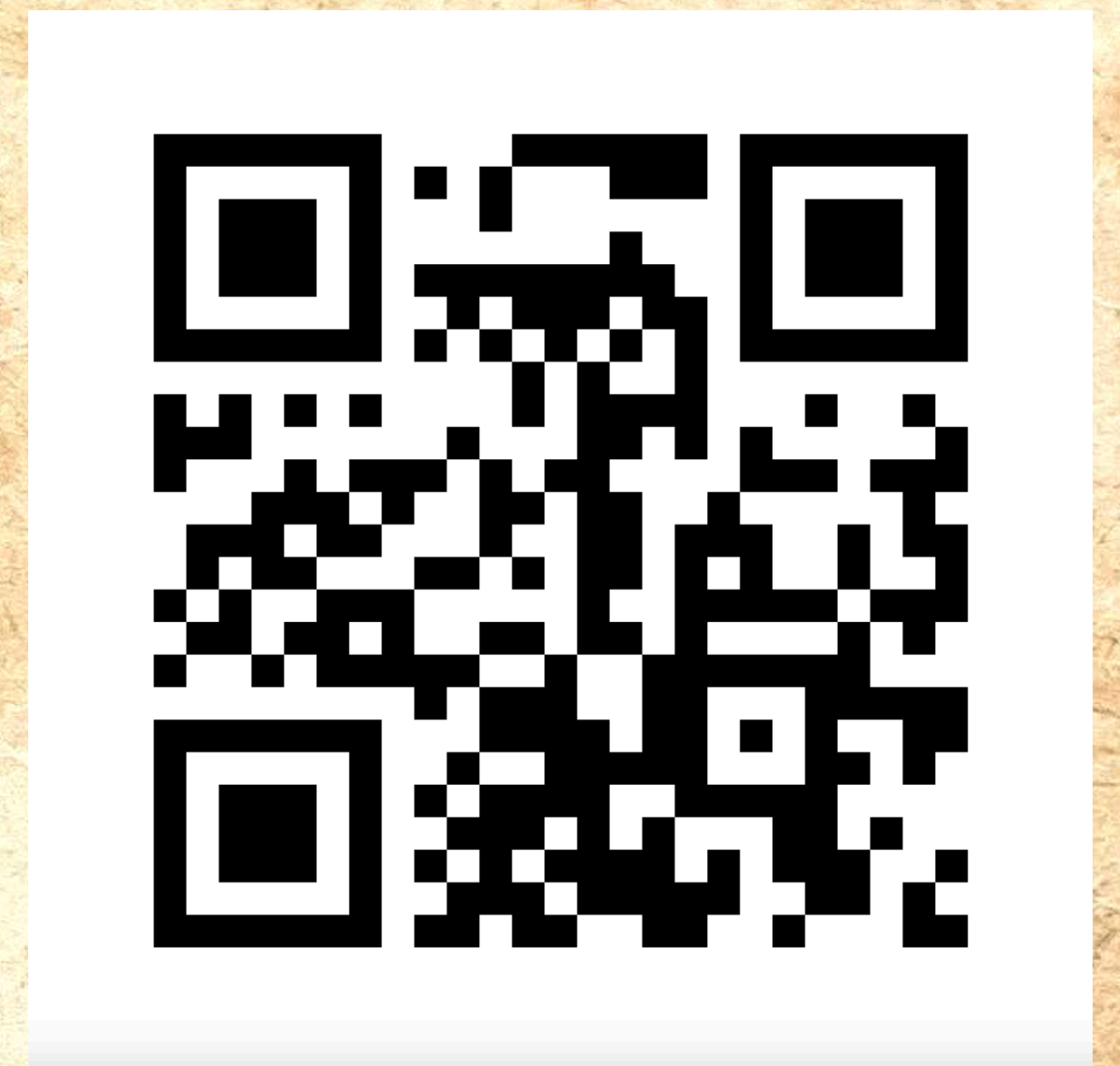
